## Sport and my walk with God

I have been playing football since I was very young like most kids do. By the time I was around 10 years old I became a goalkeeper and I suddenly fell in love with the sport; I had a desire to play professionally one day.

Around this time Helen Ivicevich was prophesising at an event in Manly, my parents decided to take me along and I ended up getting a prophecy. I was told that I would speak to many people about God in locker rooms all around the world and as I heard these words I realised that God would use me through my talent in football to reach people for his kingdom. So I decided to pursue football and I had the ego to do it, as mum said 'I acted like I was God's gift to football." I was selected for a representative team in under 11's and from there I played for Manly United for the next couple of years.

Though by the age of 14 I occurred a setback in my career and although I made into a rep team out west at the same level I noticed that my ego and my confidence was depleted. I started to get anxious before games and all I could think about was making mistakes. I then broke my hand early in the season for the second time in two years and the recovery for this time was a lot longer. I ended up having a good season though after my injury fully healed, but I

was then faced with another setback: being dropped by this team.

I was then club-less and could not find a club, it was here that I considered quitting football and I almost signed with a very low division team just to play, but me and my mum kept praying and asking for answers and I don't think without the courage my mum gave me to continue on that I would be still be playing football at a high level. God then delivered and I was called up by a team I had trailed with two weeks prior (to sign with). Although the team was in the division below where I had played the previous year I was still very grateful to have a club. I started off really well in this new club but my anxiousness from the season before was still very much present and the thing with

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anxiety is even though you think it's not having such a large impact, it does. Coaches notice you and too much anxiety stops you from performing to the best of your abilities due to constant stress of failing. I was causing myself to be overtaken by fear.

As the season went on we won the championship and were promoted to a higher division. Due to the coach telling me I was signed I decided to stay with the club, but when trials were over I was dropped

and again faced another setback. I kept asking God, what I had done or what I wasn't doing that was causing me to constantly fail. I then remember mum telling me how God doesn't give us more then we can handle and that it is just the devil challenging my faith. I remember mum showing me James 1:12 "Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial, because when he has stood the test, he will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love him." This scripture basically laid out what was going to happen if I kept at my football.

After weeks of searching I found a club again in the same league. I had a great season at this club, but again I continued to be anxious and almost did not believe in what I was doing, so even though we had won the grand final I was dropped from this team after the season was over. By this time I realised what was wrong and instead of feeling sorry for myself and wondering what went wrong, I got myself up and I got into another team straight away.

I had realised what my problem was: it wasn't lack of talent, it was my lack of love for the sport and my lack to do well and to want to become a professional. After experiencing so many setbacks I had unconsciously told myself that

I didn't really want to play professional football and in doing this I lost my love for the sport.

So in the next season I totally focused on enjoying what I did and getting that love back for the sport, and by the end of the season I wasn't dropped and I decided to aim for a higher division. I got help for my anxiety problem, and I made it into an U20 premier league 1 team which is an age group above and I have been asked to trial for a national youth league team after training with an A league team

I have my love back for football again and I am loving life and although I have not started evangelising through my football yet, I believe now that all my areas are in place and as I start to develop my relationship with God, he will reveal to me how to do this.

## Christians in Sport - 10 tips to help you pray more

Here are 10 tried and tested ways to remember to pray more:

1. Prayer card. Write three names of people you are praying for on the back of a prayer card (you can get one



from any Christians in Sport staff member or contact the office for one and we'll pop it in the post) and put it in your wallet/purse or on your mirror so that you see it all the time. When you see it, remember to pray for your friends.

- 2. **Prayer journal.** It's great to keep a prayer journal for the group. Each time you meet and pray write down who you pray for and what your prayers are. It can be an amazing encouragement to look back and see how God has been at work and also a challenge to keep investing in and praying for people, and not to give up on them.
- 3. **Pick up a stone.** On one side put the names of your friends in sport from your prayer card. Put the stone on your pillow and when you move it each night and put it back each morning, pray for the people on the stone! Remember that God is mighty to save!
- 4. **Photos.** Put photos of your friends on your wall, or as wallpaper on your computer or phone. When you see the photos pray for them.
- 5. **Plan.** One reason we don't pray is because we don't plan to pray! Think about each day and plan when you'll put time aside to pray (it might be different each day but work out a weekly plan).

6. Group prayer. If you meet as a group it is good to have a club/team focus each session, in which you all



spend time praying for one person's club in the group. That person can explain a bit about the club they play in, what the atmosphere is like, what the players and manager/coach is like, what temptations there are etc, and any specific requests that they have.

- 7. **Texts/calls.** Whenever someone rings you up or texts you, why not pray for them? Once you've finished the call or replied to the text thank God that he made them and loves them!
- 8. **Fast.** Why don't you decide to fast for a period each week (maybe 1 or 2 meals or the TV or something else) and use the time to pray for your friends.
- 9. **String.** Have a piece of string and tie it somewhere so you'll see it each day (sports bag, somewhere in your room, steering wheel of your car!) Every time you see the piece of string pray for your friends on your prayer card.
- 10. **Daily routine.** Do you pass a tall building or landmark? If so whenever you see it look up and remember that God reigns. Pray that He would reign in your life and in the lives of your friends in sport.

## **Come Again**

**Awakening** Isa 64.1-9; Ps 80:1-7, 17-19; 1 Cor 1:1-9; Mark 13:24-37

#### Introduction

I cannot recall a sermon topic which has been more of a challenge to my own spirituality than this one. With teaching on the Second Coming of Jesus occupying about 10% of the New Testament this subject is obviously very important to God. Unfortunately the Church tends to swing between immature extremes as far as the Return of Christ is concerned.

As an impressionistic new believer attending a Pentecostal Church in the 70's we were taught that the Cold War would lead to Armageddon and the End of the world. Reading *The Late Great Planet Earth*, a book that sold 28 million copies, I heard that Jesus would come back before 1988 and I felt very scared. What about this recent picture of a happy looking African riding a bike with a huge poster "Jesus Is Coming Back" on its handle bars. He is much closer to the spirit of the New Testament than most of us sophisticated Westerners. Jesus repeatedly says in the book of Revelation, "I am coming *soon*" (3:11; 22:7, 12, 20). Hebrews takes it as a matter of fact that believers are "eagerly" awaiting the coming of Christ (Heb 9:28; cf. Tit 2:13).

The gap between these biblical affirmations and our contemporary experience is huge, Australian Christians regularly recite the Creed "He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead", but what practical difference does this testimony make to our lives. When was the last time someone asked you why your life is "different" from the average and you gave an answer in terms of your hope in the Second Coming (1 Pet 3:15)? John's pastoral exhortation should hold our attention; "And now, little children, abide in him, so that when he appears we may have confidence and not *shrink from him in shame* 

at his coming." (1 John 2:28). Ambitions to see the kids/grandkids grow up are real, plans to enjoy retirement and travel are real, study and work goals are real etc. but the Return of Jesus to End the world just doesn't seem real. The Lord warned us that coldness towards his Return would happen.

#### Time

Let me start with a very perplexing scripture; "But concerning that day or that hour, no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." (Mark 13:32). Jesus normally talks confidently of his knowledge of the Father (John 5:20 cf. 15:1; Matt 11:27), but here he explains the Father has intentionally not

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revealed to him the time of his Return. Jesus is deeply longing to come back cleanse to end all suffering and sin and to perfect his Bride the Church (Eph 5:25-27; 2 Pet 3:11-13; Rev 19:6-10; 21:1-4); yet he remains in submission to his Father about the secret timing of his Return. Whilst it is foolish to attempt to calculate the time of the Second Coming, to get on with life as though it can never happen in our lifetime is just as unwise; and this is the problem of our Church today

#### **Awake**

Christ warns us of the urgent need for watchfulness; "33 Beware, *keep alert;* for you do not know when the time will come. 34 It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch. 35 Therefore, *keep awake* - for you do not know when the master of the house will come...36 or else he may *find you asleep* when he comes suddenly. 37 And what I say to you I say to all: *Stay awake*." (Mark 13:33-37). The sort of alertness Jesus has in mind is clarified by the story of the disciples in Gethsemane.

"34 And he said to them, "I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and *keep awake*." 35...he threw himself on the ground and prayed...36..."Abba, Father, for you all things are possible; remove this cup from me; yet, not what I want, but what you want." 37 He came and found them sleeping; and he said..."...Could you not *keep awake* one hour? 38 *Keep awake* and pray that you may not come into the time of trial..." (Mark 14:34-38).

Every Sunday we pray "Save us from the time of trial" but like the disciples asleep in Gethsemane if we are not on alert for the return of our Master we have already submitted to temptation. Spiritual slumber is a surprisingly everyday affair. Jesus said, "in Noah's day. 38 ...before the flood, the people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage... 39 People didn't realize what was going to happen until the flood came and swept them all away. That is the way it will be when the Son of Man returns." (Matthew 24:37-39). The sudden judgement of God will come on people, not because they are murderers, robbers or rapists, but simply because they are too preoccupied with the cares of this life to care about Christ's Return as Judge (Mark 4:19). Let me put the importance of anticipating Jesus' Return in another way.

Knowing he faces martyrdom Paul writes; "there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will award to me on the day he returns, and not only to me but also to all who have *loved and longed for his appearing*." (2 Timothy 4:7-8). Paul loves and longs for the Return of Jesus because it will mean the marvellous completion

of the purpose for which God created the world. As a young man the search for the meaning of life nearly drove me crazy, especially when I had been drinking. But then I met Jesus, and the reason why I was born, studied, then later married, worked, had children, ministered and so on was revealed. Jesus came, suffered, died, rose from the dead *and is coming back* so that we might share in the eternal love that he has enjoyed with the Father from eternity (John 17:23-26). If most of the Australian church functions as if there was no Second Coming it is because we do not know the deep heart of God. To go deeper with God we must understand God the Father as the ultimate answer to everything.

#### **Father**

The speaker in Isaiah who so boldly cries out to God; "Oh that you would rend the heavens and come down," does so at a time when it seems like the anger of the Lord has settled on stricken Israel. Instead of throwing his hands up in despair this man of faith appeals to the most fundamental relationship we can ever have with God; "But now, O LORD, *you are our Father*; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand." (Isa 64:1, 5, 8). As in Isaiah's day, the deepest revelations of God as Father come to us when our circumstances suggest he has abandoned us.

Whilst the disciples fell asleep in Gethsemane Jesus prayerfully remained on guard and met the Father in a marvellous way. Though his grief was so great that he felt he was dying then and there he addressed God in an exceptional way, "Abba! Father!" "Dear, dear, Father!" (Mark 14:34, 36). Jesus knew that the Father had sovereignly set the painful circumstances and time of his death just as he has marked the exact time of his Return (Mark 13:32; John 3:16; Gal 4:4; Acts 2:23). The sovereign Father, who alone knows why we have been waiting 2000 years for Jesus to come back, is known in the intimacy of "Abba" in the midst of terrible (apocalyptic) trials when the whole world seems to be in convulsion and all outward evidence, the evidence of terror, violence, disease and neglect, suggest that God is full of anger (Isa 64:5, 9; Ps 80:4). The deep human conviction that God is an angry Father explains Jesus' prediction "will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? 8 I tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man returns, will he find faith on earth?' (Luke 18:7-8)!

Peter long ago prophesied of the times in which we live; "scoffers will come in the last days...saying, "Where is the promise of his coming? From before the times of our ancestors, everything has remained the same since the world was first created."" (2 Peter 3:3-4). People just get on with life as though this world will go on and on and on because there is no one coming who will bring justice to the earth (Acts 17:31).

#### **Spirit**

Praying last Wednesday here in church I came across this scripture which speaks directly to our struggles to sense the importance of the Second Coming. "29 Do not use harmful words, but only helpful words, the kind that build up ...so that what you say will do good to those who hear you. 30 And do not make God's Holy Spirit sad; for the Spirit is God's ... guarantee that the Day will come when God will set you free." (Eph 4:29-30). Negative thinking and speaking grieves the Holy Spirit so we *cannot* sense his joy and anticipation in revealing to us the reality of the Return of Christ. The Bible story culminates in these words addressed to Jesus; "The Spirit and the Bride say, "Come."" (Rev 22:17). No one who has negativity, resentment, bitterness or anger in their heart can ever hear the Spirit's happy voice calling out to Jesus to *come back*. Our Church is full of people whose traumatic life experiences are blocking a spontaneous spiritual longing for Jesus to Return. Let me list some traumas.

Unless you have already received a miracle of inner healing: if you have suffered domestic abuse your heart will not thrill at the prospect of being eternally married to Jesus; if you have endured verbal abuse the thought of having Christ's thoughts filling your mind will not be inspirational; if you have had the trauma of sexual abuse the notion of unlimited intimacy with Jesus cannot excite you; for those who have suffered physical abuse the thought of losing all control over your own when the Lord returns life is not a happy one. A few of us are openly aggressive people, others are simply passively aggressive, some of us are angry at God for not rescuing us from a terrible situation, a few are enraged about what is happening to others and there is no one to defend them. Many regular churchgoers deep down feel that the Father of Jesus is disappointed with them and have no desire to meet him at the judgement. All these natural human responses to pain cut off the inspiring revelation of the soon Return of Christ.

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Since I believe that God is always speaking to us through current events I need to say something about the Phillip Hughes tragedy. The mass national outpouring of grief is a sign that our deep national ethic of a "Fair Go!" has been radically challenged. Aussies believe if it's not fair it's not right and therefore it should never happen. It's just not fair that talented young people die. Christians must with boldness proclaim that much of life isn't fair, on the surface it does not look like God is fair, and the only guarantee that fairness will prevail is that Jesus is coming back to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

That Jesus will Return full of the righteous anger of his Father to cleanse the world of all that is abusive, destructive and unfair is a core part of the gospel (2 Thess 1:5-10; James 1:19-20). A gospel which encourages the followers of Jesus by these words to live with supreme confidence; "you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ, 8 who will sustain you to the end, guiltless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ." (1 Cor 1:7-8).

#### Conclusion

That Jesus is coming back soon is measureless good news and the only real hope for a world smitten by suffering, terror and death. When Paul wants to explain to the Church how it is "that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope" he expounds the Second Coming (1 Thess 4:13). Our ability to impart hope in the midst of suffering has fallen a long way since Paul's day. After the 9/11 disaster there was a spike in church attendance in America, but within six months there were less church-goers than before. Why? Because the Western Church has lost the power of the hope of the Return of Christ (1 John 3:2-3). We are like a Bride who does not expect her Groom to turn up at the altar, like an abused person not expecting justice from a Judge or like an innocence person anticipating they will be declared guilty by a tribunal. God's entire reputation as holy and just rides on the Return of Christ. At the end of Revelation, a book which with unique power tells the story of the vile abuses of human history and the trail of bloodied injustice flowing from persecution, there arises a great and unified

reply from the saints of God to the words of Jesus. Our Lord says, "Surely I am coming soon." The Church replies; "Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!" (Rev 22:20).

If you know you love the Lord and also know that your desire to see him come back is weak, we need to ask him to send his Spirit so that we really and truly want him to come back soon. And for those who amongst us who have no interest at all in the proclamation that Christ will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, we will pray for you, for you are in imminent danger of a lost eternity. Grace, John.

## Jesus ... the Life Transformer

#### Tadiwa

Tad is a beautiful 31 year old African woman. She grew up in Zimbabwe in a loving and caring Christian family but at a young age, she was sexually abused by a family friend and by a cousin. Tad managed to shut out the memories of abuse during her childhood, but as she approached her late teens she began to recall the events and feelings of hate and anger began to surface towards God and towards herself for what had happened.

After finishing school in Zimbabwe, Tad came to Australia to attend University and it was at this time that she made the decision to completely turn her back on God and walk away from everything she'd been brought up to believe. She started to make really bad decisions and began drinking and taking drugs, which led her to a place of complete loathing. She was forced to do things she would never have thought possible in an effort to support her drug habit and she became trapped in this cycle of hopelessness.

Meanwhile, her parents were earnestly praying for her. She would have arguments with her Mum over the phone as she tried to talk sense to her daughter and encourage her back to God, but Tadiwa would have none of it. Eventually though, Tad reached rock bottom and she knew she couldn't go on this way. Although she had people around her, they were living similar lives and her world felt empty and cold ... she was totally lost. Her Mum had told her about a Christian show on TV called "Your Best Life" with Ps Phil Pringle so that night, Tad decided to turn it on. She felt stirred by the message and she felt God's love as He began to gently draw her close again. She picked up her Bible and started to read the Scriptures and hope filled her heart. The following weekend Tad visited the church. It was a big step but as she entered the doors she knew she was 'home' and she didn't have to run anymore. The struggle was over as she said the prayer of salvation and found peace and healing back in the arms of Christ. She knew her life would never be the same again and she wept tears of joy as God replaced beauty for her ashes.

A few weeks later Tad enrolled in Bible college and recently completed her first ministry trip to the Philippines where she worked with young woman who had escaped the sex trade. She has a dream to move over there and work in the area of human trafficking. Tad said, 'I just want to pass on the same love and healing that I got from God's House and see others lives transformed like mine'.

Jeremiah 29:11: 'for I know the plans I have for you' says the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a future and a hope'.

This Christmas, let's remember to be thankful for God's great love and redeeming grace. He sent His Son so that all might know the hope of glory i.e. Christ in us. What a wonderful reason to celebrate!

Poverty would and depression be non-existent as all would be concerned that no-one in our global family is without or unloved. Children would be safe everywhere and live in total confidence that they live in a world community that treats them as unique and cherished individuals, but also teaches them of our responsibility to always acknowledge, not man, but God as our just and loving Father. Think about it: what is money? The Oxford Dictionaries definition of money in English:

#### A current medium of exchange in the form of coins and banknotes

"A current medium of exchange", i.e. it is a means of trading for goods or services using the denominations that are provided by a common financial system. As most of you would be aware, bartering was the early means of trading and this practice is still carried out today in less-developed areas of the world, but for the most part money has replaced bartering for practical reasons (e.g. it's hard to carry round enough chickens to pay for a motorcycle, and the seller can only eat so many chickens unless he plans to barter them for something else). Whether you use money or bartering, the principle is always to exchange goods or services of equivalent value.

The currency of love has a very different value system - ask any serious parent if they expect an equivalent value back from their children for that they've spent on them: their answer would be "No", at least for the reason that their parents also did not expect to be refunded for their own upbringing. Parents do however expect to be acknowledged and respected - they advise, reward and discipline their children because they only want them to do well in life.

God our Father has also paid for us

No one can redeem the life of another or give to God a ransom for them - the ransom for a life is costly, no payment is ever enough - so that they should live on forever and not see decay. [Psalm 49:7-9]

For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all people. This has now been witnessed to at the proper time. [1 Timothy 2:5-6]

... You are not your own; you were bought at a price... [1 Corinthians 6:19-20]

God also does not ask us to repay the price of His son - He gladly came to earth, became 'a little lower than the angels' (Hebrews 2:9) and paid our ransom with his death in order that we could be restored to Him. It doesn't stop there - He still offers us so much more (1 Corinthians 2:9 etc.) All he requires from us is our obedience in love.

You can't collect love and use it to control people because love is always given freely. You can't exchange it into another currency because there is nothing of equivalent value. You can't buy it from shops because it is only available from one source: God Himself. Christmas is about love incarnate; love made flesh and born in a barn.

To all who read this; grace and peace to you from our ever generous Father in heaven and Christ Jesus His son.

We pray you have a great time with Jesus and His family on this celebration of His incarnation - Christmas 2014.


## Why Not Here, Lord? Faith-filled Prayer Breakthroughs

My cell phone spurs me on each time it powers up with AT&T's motto, "Rethink Possible!" Marketers, in this case, are good theologians—and Christians in the Western world would do well to take this exhortation seriously.

When it comes to praying for God's miraculous intervention, why is it so easy for us in the West to default to the position of unbelief? Why do people in the Third World seem to experience more of the miracle-working power of God?

How can we grow in faith and pray history-shaping prayers for our community and nation and world—and rethink possible?



A few weeks ago, while I was pondering a new development that could result in a new ministry opportunity, some friends from Southeast Asia came to visit my family. I had pretty much concluded that this "possible opportunity" was a long shot. But in that moment of wondering, my visiting friends presented my wife and me with a beautiful pewter wall piece etched with the words, "Nothing is impossible." I had jumped to an unbelieving conclusion. And their gift was a loving rebuke.

#### **Assume the Possible**

Why do we so readily assume that things will not go our way or that they're impossible to attain? I can hear the Lord saying to me as He did to His slow, unperceptive disciples, "Where is your faith?"

Our same visiting friends had been in Myanmar in 2010 to help launch the Children in Prayer movement in that much oppressed nation. And in January 2011, I had the privilege of joining hundreds of ministry leaders for a second, similar effort. Out of those two events, an estimated 40,000 children mobilized to pray for their nation.

Nothing seemed to budge in Myanmar—spiritually or politically—until the children began to intercede. Then, in short order, the whole nation seemed to shift. The military junta, which had dominated the land with an iron grip, released political dissidents from prison, including the Nobel laureate Aung San Suu Kyi. Greater economic freedom was granted. Reconciliation efforts suddenly began between some of the ethnic groups that the government had been fighting for many years.

Political news commentators did not know how to explain such a precipitous turn-around in a nation so long accustomed to tyrannical oppression. But the prayer ministry leaders believed that "God's secret weapon," the prayers of children, were a major factor.

When I was with World Vision, an international humanitarian and childcare organization, we witnessed the same phenomenon. As director of prayer ministries, I asked field staff in five countries to have the children in the program pray for their very poor communities for one year. All of us were astonished by the miracles that occurred in those communities where the kids were praying for specific needs: the infrastructural changes, such as digging wells and establishing new clinics, resolving community splits, the healing of people with terminal illnesses, and the prevention of terrorist invasions in the places where the prayer was happening!

Staff people asked if we could renew the children's prayer effort for another year. After a second consultation, people recited an even longer litany of miracles to the wonderment of all. The Children in Prayer (CiP) effort spread by word of mouth to 20 national offices, and later about 50 of our World Vision national offices continued developing CiP efforts. Even after I left World Vision, the prayer movement spread beyond that organization with an estimated 75–80 countries supporting CiP efforts. This is all to the glory of the Lord who loves the prayers of children!

#### Learn the Children's Secret

Why are children's prayers so powerful? How can they serve as a model to us more skeptical, slow-to-believe (continued next page)

adults?

Jesus taught that He has delegated authority to believers so we can even bring Satan down in our communities and nations. Jesus said He saw Satan "fall like lightning from heaven" and that the authority of Jesus will enable us to "trample on snakes and scorpions and to overcome all the power of the enemy" (Luke 10:18–19).

Moments later, Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, was rejoicing as His people overcame the devil and brought deliverance. He joyously praised the Father for revealing these things to "little children" (v. 21). Apparently children have a greater openness to receiving such a revelation from God. The implication is that His adult disciples will be slower to grasp such a reality unless they cultivate the same childlike hearts. In other places, Jesus said that the Kingdom of God belongs to people who are like children, and that we adults should seek to be like them (Matt. 18:2–4, 19:14). Why? Because adults tend to be encumbered by the baggage of doubt, fear, and wrong belief systems that keep us from simply trusting God to do what He promises to do.

We have become captive to a materialistic and non-supernatural worldview. We may not realize how deeply we have become affected by this corrosive influence. But if we ignore God's promises to do the impossible (if we will simply ask, trusting Him like small children depending on their parents),

it is as if we, in effect, have taken scissors to Scripture.

I believe this is a major reason why serious and persistent prayer is not on the agenda of most Christians and ministry leaders in the West. We live in a material world seemingly controlled only by laws of nature, so we have imbibed the idea that prayer makes little or no difference.

Humanism's teaching that "man is the measure of all things" has also crept into our thinking. Both are false philosophical teachings that cut off the realization that God is the One in whom "we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28).

**Believe We Can Change History - Get Desperate** 

It has been my great privilege to be part of numerous national and

international prayer initiatives throughout the world for more than two decades. Over and over again, my colleagues and I have witnessed the stupendous works of God when His people have prayed in unity, together releasing their faith. To His glory, history has literally been reshaped through these efforts!

Many of these prayer initiatives have happened in war zones where insoluble ethnic conflicts, full of atrocities, ground on for years—where all hope had been lost.

In every case I can remember, such history-changing prayer initiatives have been characterized by the participants' sense of true desperation. Circumstances of war, suffering, or corruption seemed overpowering and impossible to change—by human means. Christ's people were driven to seek the Lord with all their hearts, realizing there was no other hope.

Of course, this is exactly what our God is waiting for us to do as well. He said, "If . . . you seek the Lord your God, you will find him if you seek him with all your heart and with all your soul" (Deut. 4:29). I believe this is the kind of desperation God wants us to cultivate in the West. Because everything here is usually predictable, comfortable, and convenient, we are often blind to dangers that threaten us internally and externally, spiritually and physically.

It is time to wake up, becoming both vigilant and desperate in praying for the Lord's transforming breakthroughs. Let's "rethink possible" and trust Him to do as He promises—far beyond all we can ask or think—in our lives, communities, and the entire world!

#### INDIA: Christian Community Attacked by Mob of Hindu Radicals

A crowd of more than 100 Hindu extremists have attacked and beaten a Pentecostal Christian community in Udumalpet, the southern state of Tamil Nadu, on 16 November.

The Reverend K A Sathis, pastor of Konkal Marthoma Church, and four church members were hospitalised in serious conditions. Some attackers even followed the victims to the hospital, threatening them and attacking them a second time.

Before breaking into the church, where the community was holding a prayer service, the radical group destroyed more than 20 vehicles parked in the church yard. Once inside, the militants attacked those present, desecrated the altar, burned the Bibles and broke musical instruments.

Sajan K George, president of the Global Council of Indian Christians (GCIC) has already asked for protection for the Christian community of the state from the National Commission for Human Rights, the chief minister of Tamil Nadu and the Minister of Interior of the Central Government of India.

#### **LAOS: Christians Purged and Arrested**

The animism practised by Laos' ethnic minorities requires constant appeasement of spirits. When villagers become Christians and stop participating in sacrifices and rituals, animists consider this a serious threat. Fearful and angry, animist villagers drive Christians from their homes and farms, expelling them from their village and leaving them destitute.

Six ethnic Hmong families (25 individuals), recently driven out of their village in central Laos, are desperate to return. The district governor, Thongsam, has agreed to investigate.

Also, seven ethnic Hmong were arrested in Laos' far north-west on 2 November after they became Christians. Five were released after renouncing their faith, while the two who refused to recant were imprisoned. Laotian prisons are squalid and torture is routine.

#### **CHINA: Christian Prisoner Soon to be Released**

Former bookstore employee Wenxi Li is currently scheduled for release from a Shanxi province prison on 18 December.

Wenxi Li, from Beijing, had travelled to Shanxi province to help local Christians open a new bookstore. Police raided the new business and confiscated hundreds of books. On 19 December 2012, Wenxi was asked to come to a police station to retrieve the \$6,000 worth of books that police had seized. When he arrived, he was immediately arrested and sent to prison. Wenxi was denied bail and sentenced to two years in prison on 17 June 2013.

The family is cautiously optimistic that he will be released on schedule. Since his transfer to his current prison a few months ago, he has received better treatment and has been allowed to make sporadic five-minute calls to his family. His wife, Cai Hong Li, says he sounds encouraged and is in good health.

Though she hopes he will rest, she told VOM staff Wenxi Li is passionate about the bookstore ministry and will likely want to return to ministry as soon as he is released. Cai Hong asks for prayers for her husband's release as well as for her own health. The imprisonment has been difficult for her.

While in prison Wenxi shared the Gospel with other inmates and several became Christians.

- **♥** Human Life.



To date it has been signed by over 50,000 Australians.


#### A Call of Christian Conscience

The Canberra Declaration was drafted by a cross-section of Christian leaders. It was first read out on 23 July 2010

on the lawns of Parliament House in Canberra. Because of threats to redefine marriage it was released with a sense of urgency just four weeks before the 2010 federal election.

The original visionaries were inspired by the 2009 Manhattan Declaration of the USA. Like the Manhattan Declaration, the Canberra Declaration is a document by Christians, to Christians about the great need to appreciate and no longer passively take for granted Judeo-Christian values in our nation. And like the Manhattan Declaration the Canberra Declaration is described as 'a call of Christian conscience'. What does this mean?







#### The Hour is Late

Nine years ago one of Australia's best-known geological landmarks made a big splash! It was a grey day when one of the Twelve Apostles suddenly and unexpectedly collapsed into a heap of rubble.

Many Australians are only now suddenly awakening to the realization that the Judeo-Christian foundations of our society have drastically eroded and are in danger of collapse.

#### A Call to Pray and Act

The Canberra Declaration, as a call of Christian conscience calls Christians who have signed the Canberra Declaration to pray and act through its Good News Updates. And so signees to the Canberra Declaration are often asked to write to politicians or make submissions to Senate inquiries.

The Canberra Declaration acknowledges that Western civilisation, which was built on Judeo-Christian foundations, has been in steep moral decline. This is not all due to merely social, cultural, political and philosophical forces. We must see the battle as spiritual. The apostle Paul wrote,

"For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought and make it obedient to Christ" (2 Corinthians 10:3-5).

The four National Days of Prayer and Fasting and the three 40 Days of Prayer and Fasting (40daysofprayer.com.au) held since then have been strategic opportunities to positively and powerfully address the three focus areas of the Canberra Declaration.

#### A Life and Death Struggle

With God's help and in partnership with Christian organisations we need to vigorously contend for our religious freedoms, for the institution of marriage and our families and for the sanctity of human life.



The Culture of Light and Life is represented by the thriving bushland on the left. It represents a way of life that is based on the truth that all human life has been made in the image of God. The Canberra Declaration states that every human life; male or female; young or old; perfect or imperfect, is precious in God's eyes and has equal value from conception to life's natural end.

The Culture of Darkness and Death is represented by the burnt forest on the right. It represents a way of death that is seen in the deliberate taking of human life through such things as abortion, euthanasia, destruction of human embryos, murder and suicide. These manifestations of death are Satan's way to destroy those who are made in the image of God.

**The advancing fire line** in the photo is where the Culture of Darkness and Death is overtaking the Culture of Light and Life.

The Canberra Declaration, as a call of Christian conscience, encourages Christians to resist the engulfing flames of satanic lies and practises with the truth of the Word of God, with prayer and with acts of love. We believe the fire can be extinguished. And when the billows of dark smoke have blown away then a new forest can be planted!

#### Stan (in response):

say. I like to think I get special assignments from God to go to dark places.

## Marriage & Divorce in 2013

The statistics for 2013 relating to Marriage and Divorce for our nation have just been released by the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

Whilst the estimated resident population grew by a little over 0.4m from 2012 to 2013 the number of marriages decreased by 3.5%. That is 118962 marriage in 2013 against 123244 in 2012. This gives a fall in the crude marriage rate from 5.4% to 5.1% marriages per 1000 estimated population. Interestingly the statistics also reveal that whilst the majority of couples, 91123 or 76.6%, who were married in 2013 cohabited prior to marriage whereas in 2012 there were 95673, or 77.6% of, couples who cohabited prior to marriage.

Sadly, for the church, the proportion of marriages performed by civil celebrants has increased now standing at a figure of 72.5% which is a far cry from 20 years ago when the share of civil celebrants was only 42.1%. It is also interesting to note at this point that in the ABS November 2013 issue of Social Trends 22% of Australians reported 'no religion' in the 2011 census two decades previously this was 12/13% the Christian Church has certainly lost some ground!

2013 saw that the majority of brides (81.3% in 2012 this was 80.8%) and grooms (79.7% in 2012 this was 79.2%) had not previously married. Also there was a negligible increase in the median age at marriage of 0.1 years for both male (now 31.5 years) and females (now 28.5 years). Whilst it can be said that people are still choosing to be married there is that rate of cohabitation hiding behind the figures.

Turning to divorce, there is a decrease in numbers 47638 against 49917 and with the previously mentioned estimated increase in population this has meant a fall in the crude rate of divorce from 2.2 to 2.1. These divorces affecting some 41747 children under the age of 18 years. The total costs to the children, their parents and families let alone the nation are really incalculable, it is hard enough to come to \$ costings but recently Minister Kevin Andrews said "with the cost of long term marriage and relationship breakdowns costing individuals \$60,000 on average" (Daily Telegraph 3/08/2014). In July 2014 News Corp undertook an "analysis of information from the Attorney-General's Department, the Department of Human Services and the Department of Social Services, shows that this financial year alone the government will spend \$12.5 billion on support payments to single parents, including family tax benefits and rent assistance. Another \$1.5 billion will be spent on the administration of the child support system, while the cost to taxpayers from family disputes in Australian courts is \$202 million." (News.com.au 6/07/2014) All adding up to more than a 14 billion cost per annum.

It is time to start rebuilding marriage, yes there is still the need to defend marriage but there is probably a greater need to rebuild marriage! From what we see in the media and what we hear people speaking it seems many hold a distorted view of marriage. This is probably strongest in young adults and is reflected in the levels of cohabitation before marriage — a 'beta testing' of marriage. The view could be summed up as being "a romanticised vision and understanding of marriage...an affirmation of romantic love between two willing people and some sort of commitment" and unfortunately this sort of reduced understanding has spilled over into parts of the church.

How do we counter this, how do we start rebuilding marriage? A good starting point is to increase our teaching on what love and marriage means in the context of God's word and society. This should be done in all parts of the local church and all age groups. Then also look at how to be pro-active with practical and relevant ministry for those who are married. Start the re-building of marriage now and then celebrate, honour marriage and marriages in the national celebration Marriage Week, 13 – 19 September 2015.

He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted,
To proclaim liberty to the captives,
And the opening of the prison to those who are bound;"

#### Luke 4:18

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me,
Because He has anointed Me
To preach the gospel to the poor;
He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted,[a]
To proclaim liberty to the captives
And recovery of sight to the blind,
To set at liberty those who are oppressed;"

The anointing that break the yoke is our ADVANTAGE MOMENT.

So send I, you with the anointing of the Holy Spirit. John 20:20 So Jesus said to them again, "Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." Jesus has ordained you John 15:16 King James Version (KJV) 16 "Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and **ordained** you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you".

So this is our ADVANTAGE MOMENT. One Chance, One Choice and One MOMENT and now it is for YOU to ASK our heavenly Father who gives the Holy Spirit, beyond measure to those who ASK. One MOMENT of ADVANTAGE with the HOLY SPIRIT of the LIVING GOD is available for us while we are here on earth as it is in heaven. It's worth the asking. Give it a go, give it a chance. Taste and See that the Lord is good all the time, all the way and always.

Moreover, let us enter into the Most Holy Place to worship God in the Holy of Holies and experience this ADVANTAGE MOMENT in greater measure. Hebrews 4:16 "Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need. **We** also need the ingredient of the BLOOD of JESUS who is the prerequisite to enter the Holy of holies.

The Samaritan woman had an encounter with Jesus in John 4:20 "Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, and you Jews say that in Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship." John 4: 21 Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe Me, the hour is coming when you will neither on this mountain, nor in Jerusalem, worship the Father". John 4: 24 "God is Spirit, and those who worship Him MUST worship in spirit and truth."
